A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF DAVIDSON RESTRICTING THE TIME DURING WHICH CHILDREN
MAY BE ON THE STREETS OR IN PUBLIC PLACES.

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Davidson, in the Province of Saskatchewan,
in open meeting, hereby enact as follows:


1. No child shall without reasonable excuse be on any street, or in any public place within the limits of the Town of Davidson when not accompanied by his or her parent or legal guardian: after the hour of 11:00 o'clock p.m. and before the hour of 6:00 o'clock a.m. if such child is of the age of fifteen (15) or under.
2. Any Peace Officer, in pursuance of this by-law, may demand the name, age, and address of any person whom he has reason to believe is under the age of sixteen (16) years, and should such person refuse the information, or, if the Officer has reason to believe that the information provided is false, he may examine the person further, and if such person fails upon demand to give his or her name, age, and address, or fails to give a reasonable excuse for being on such street, or in such public place after the hours specified in Section 1, the Officer may:
 - (a) Warn the child and order him/her to proceed directly to his/her place of residence forthwith, and thereafter notify the parents or guardian in writing of the action taken; or
 - (b) Take such child to the local police station and notify the parents or guardian by telephone of the child's whereabouts, and detain the child at the police station pending the arrival of the parents or guardian; or
 - (c) Take the child to his/her place of residence and leave such child with his/her parents or guardian; and
 - (d) In any case where the Peace Officer has reason to believe that a child is being neglected, or that the parents or guardian are unable or unwilling to comply with the provisions of this by-law, he shall report the circumstance to the Department of Welfare.
3. Any parent or guardian of a child under the age of sixteen (16) years who permits such child to be on any street or in any public place within the limits of the Town of Davidson in violation of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on summary conviction for the first offence, to a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than ten dollars (\$10.00), and, for a second or subsequent offence, to a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00), and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term of not more than ten (10) days.
4. No parent or guardian shall be charged with a violation of this by-law, unless such parent or guardian has been given at least one written warning in respect to his or her child or children.
5. In any proceedings under this by-law, a copy of a written warning purporting to be signed by a Peace Officer shall be prima facie evidence of such warning having been given.

6. Any Peace Officer, who on reasonable and probable grounds believes that a violation of this by-law is being committed, may for the purpose of preventing or detecting such violation, stop and search any vehicle, or enter into any and every part of any place other than a dwelling house, and make search therein, and nothing in Common Law or this or any other by-law shall be construed as in any way limiting the rights and powers conferred herein.

7. This by-law shall come into force and take effect on the day of the final passing thereof.
